

Election Protection Coalition National Partner Responsibilities

Overview

Election Protection (EP) is the nation's largest **non-partisan** voter protection coalition, working throughout the year to help ensure all eligible American citizens have the opportunity to cast a meaningful ballot and have that vote counted. National partners work to support and promote the existing Election Protection infrastructure and play a role in the planning and implementation of Election Protection efforts.

Engagement Options

Organizations interested in becoming Election Protection partners can engage in a number of ways. Partners can participate in all or some of the engagement opportunities described below

1. Digital and Printed Promotion
 - a. Promoting the Election Protection Hotlines (866-OUR-VOTE, 888-VE-Y-Vota and 888-API-VOTE) to networks and on relevant digital and printed materials.
 - b. Following and engaging Election Protection and the Lawyers Committee on social media platforms including Twitter, Instagram and Facebook.
 - c. Promoting the #WhyIVote & #WhyIVolunteer Social Media campaigns on organization social media pages and sharing story collection bins with networks.
 - d. Sharing digital tools with coalition members to incorporate in civic engagement/voter education efforts.
2. Coalition Meeting Presence
 - a. Designating a staff or member representative to represent organization during national coalition meetings and calls.
 - b. Optional but encouraged participating in working groups.
3. Grassroots Support
 - a. Connecting your organizations state and local chapters/branches/affiliates to state-based Election Protection Programs.
 - b. Assisting in the promotion and recruitment of grassroots volunteers identified by the state-based voting coalition (poll monitors, rovers, rides to the polls, etc.)
 - c. Recruiting attorneys, law students and legal professionals to participate in EP hotline, legal field program or rapid response litigation.

Election Protection coalition members that wish to be acknowledged as partners can submit their logos to be added on the partner page on the 866OURVOTE website.

Election Protection Working Groups

Election Protection coalition partners are strongly encouraged to join or co-lead a working group. Working groups convene consistently around participants schedules to discuss an array of topics and issues relevant to Election Protection work.
